If you feel called to advocate for others in a meaningful way, the online bachelor's degree program in social work may be for you. The flexible scheduling and online format allows working students to maintain employment while completing their degree and preparing for licensure. The program offers a collaborative, flexible, and challenging curriculum and a sense of community in each class. Because the program is fully accredited by the Council on Social Work Education's Board of Accreditation (CSWE-BOA), graduates can sit for the Bachelor's level social work licensing exam in some states or pursue advanced standing in a master of social work program.

Virtual/Live Sessions

As an online social work student, you will meet virtually several times each semester. These meetings serve as an opportunity to discuss course content and allow you to develop relationships with peers. The virtual sessions also allow the instructor to assess what you have learned and to prepare you for entering practicum.

Practicum Experience

In addition to the 15-week semesters, students are individually matched with agencies and organizations for practicum in their local communities. In their practicum, students work 16-20 hours per week (typically business hours) in an agency-based setting for a full academic year (a total of 480 hours).
