Counseling and Art Therapy Bridge Programs

Option 1

Students may bridge from the Bachelor of Arts in Art Therapy program into the Master of Arts program in Counseling and Art Therapy by completing all of the requirements for the undergraduate major plus four additional graduate-level courses: CAT 501, 505, 591, and one CAT 1-2 credit elective.

Option 2

Some students may choose a 3+3 Bridge, spending three years in the undergraduate program followed by three years in the graduate program.
