Students in Fashion Design may choose to spend their third year at the Fashion Institute of Technology in New York City. Students who choose this track may apply for housing on campus after acceptance to F.I.T. Students are responsible for the cost of housing and transportation while in New York and seeing that all official transcripts of their completed work in New York are mailed to the Registrar's Office at Ursuline College. All work in fashion design is considered enrichment elective credit. Students receive an (AAS) Associate in Applied Science Degree from the Fashion Institute of Technology upon graduation from Ursuline College.
